

Meeting Minutes Georgia Partnership for Transportation Quality (GPTQ) Consultant Relations Committee (CRC) March 15, 2022 Microsoft Teams

I. In Progress Topics

- A. Erosion Control Plans Quality Issues
 - 1. Industry must continue to focus on improvement
 - 2. If comments from EPD indicate that EPD reviewer does not understand the intent of the designer, please let Hiral know, and she will help work with the reviewer
- B. GDOT Concept Scoping Tool
 - 1. This was a presentation topic at the Transportation Summit
 - 2. Consensus of the group is that it is a useful tool
- C. Georgia PE stamp on GDOT plans
 - 1. Frank Flanders advised that the rule was approved by the Board
 - 2. It will now go the Governor's office for signature
 - 3. Expected to be effective within two to six months

 - 1. FHWA guidance was expected by Spring regarding <u>Executive Order 13985</u>, but it has not yet been published
 - 2. Hiral asked that everyone wait until the FHWA guidance is published before implementing any changes
 - 3. Hiral also noted that GDOT received unusual FHWA comments on recent in-house projects
 - 4. If others experience the same, please contact Eric Duff so that he may help coordinate with FHWA

 - 2. Senate vote expected today; will then go to the House

 - a) FHWA is emphasizing a new focus on EJ concerns, and consultants should work through OES to address unusual EJ comments

- b) **DBE Utilization/Outreach Task Force** is focused on engaging DBE firms
 - (1) DBE narratives are being evaluated for the first time in the most recent RFQ
 - (2) On call RFQs coming out in the Spring will include the narrative requirement
 - (3) Helping with DBE training events
 - (4) Identifying steps to be taken to assist DBE outreach consultant in training DBEs on how to engage in design work and how to partner with prime consultants
- c) **References/Past Performance Task Force** has delivered recommendations to the RFQ Redesign Task Force
- d) RFQ Re-Design Task Force
 - (1) Working on changes to the RFQ template regarding availability and reference information for project experience
 - (2) Also looking more broadly at RFQ requirements to better enable GDOT's evaluators to assess SOQs
- e) **Negotiations Task Force** is focused on identifying challenges that lead to delays in the negotiation process and identifying potential improvements
 - (1) Cost proposal template lockdown during negotiation process
 - (a) Goal is to avoid changes during negotiations that result in additional back-and-forth
 - (b) Steps include (1) scoping meeting, (2) resolution of any follow-up questions, and (3) lockdown through upload into RTS
 - (2) Best practices during negotiation process and standard negotiation schedule
 - (3) Billable rates process and schedule
 - (4) Standardized manhours for routine scope items

 - (1) Directed towards elected officials with focus on planning, design, and construction of projects using State and Federal funds
 - (2) Will likely be one-to-two-hour course
 - (3) Working groups are developing lessons learned from PDP Lite course
 - (4) Mid-April meeting planned to maintain momentum on this initiative

L. Right-of-Way – Troy Hill & Mickie McJunkin

- 1. Met March 3, 2022
- 2. Focus topics
 - a) Minor personnel changes
 - b) Training dates in April (one for consultants and one for GDOT employees)
 - c) Improving the online ROW training course which will be available for consultants and GDOT employees
 - d) Moving towards electronic submittals for all right of way files
 - e) Discussed property management issues and delays with structures demolition; Katrina Anderson is working on improvements to this process
 - f) Still working on cost to cure procedures related to local governments allowing variances on GDOT projects
 - g) Identifying ways to improve the ability to add new right of way consultants
 - h) Limited availability of experienced right of way personnel in the industry
 - i) There is a shortage of appraisers, and appraisals are being delayed
 - j) Demolition easements should be included on right of way plans
 - k) Beginning August 1, 2022, full legal descriptions must be included in data tables for all easement types

 - 1. Met March 1, 2022
 - 2. Focus topics
 - a) Design Exception/Design Variance (DE/DV) Guide
 - (1) Developing controlling criteria outline based on FHWA and GDOT lists
 - (2) Tools to use in evaluating DE/DVs and clarifications or additional documentation that should be included to minimize review cycles
 - (3) The goal is to go through one round of review on DE/DVs
 - (4) Draft DE/DV Guide will be ready by the end of 2022
 - 3. Office of Design Policy and Support is working on the Safety Manual

 - a) Updating utility design training module
 - (1) Will likely be virtual
 - (2) Anticipate availability in July 2022
 - b) Utility Impact Analysis (UIA)
 - (1) Planning to introduce a UIA document during the preliminary utility routing process and will implement on pilot projects that include SUE
 - (2) For non-SUE projects, working with construction SMEs to determine impacts to bid documents if UIA is a living document
 - (3) Goal is to continue building ideas, mitigation, and avoidance
 - c) January 28, 2022 Utility Adjustment Schedule (UAS) working group
 - (1) Discussed revised second submission submittal to highlight any revisions that have occurred since initial second submission
 - (2) Concerns were shared about the time it would take to make a revised second submission; worked with Design Policy and Support and Road Design to work through pilot project to develop a Bluebeam deliverable that highlights changes
